Touring since 2003, we have delivered 2,255 performances across Canada and 198 international performances in 17 countries on four continents.

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




Backbone




We are traceable to the beginnings of the universe, our ancestral origins stretching across the Milky Way to the very atoms burning inside of us here on earth.


Adizokan

Miigis




Miigis reveals the power of nature and Indigenous prophecy through contemporary Indigenous dance, theatrical innovation, music, and film.
